Banbury Park, Blackhorse Regeneration Plan

- Plans for Blackhorse Lane have always included a proposal for a road linking Forest Road west of Blackhorse Road Station with Blackhorse Lane, to provide access to new housing developments opposite the station to reduce traffic flows through the Standard Junction (by the station).

Street Cleaning

- Management review of Street Sweeping contract etc. All issues of interest to our residents.
- Kiers seasonal leafing programme starts on today and is provisionally programmed to run from 6th October 2008 to 2nd January 2009. Separate crews will focus on clearing leaves so that the leaves can be recycled and the resources assigned to street cleaning are maintained.
- Council is starting to roll out co-mingled recycling to housing estates. We are in the process of developing a suitable scheme and looking at dual compartment litter bins which will accommodate both co-mingled re-cyclables and residual litter.



Arcade Site - Update

Statement from Cllr Wheeler

- “The aim of a mixed retail, leisure housing development with a design concept incorporating an interesting tall building and a cinema multiplex to help drive the reinvigoration of the Walthamstow Town Centre remain unchanged as previously publicised. The scheme remains on track and the Council awaits the Developer's, St Modwens, Planning Application which will include its design proposals.
- The details of the design depend on the needs mainly of retailers and housing providers who join the scheme and these in turn are influenced by the current economic situation.
- The Council remains strongly committed to the scheme and sees considerable advantage in keeping the scheme on track to take advantage of the eventual economic upturn and the influence of developments at Stratford and the Olympics. the Council is also looking to see how it may support the scheme.”



Community Engagement with Youths

Walthamstow Academy, School

- Communication from the Principal for a strong local lobby by all partners to support her staff application to have their police liaison officer reinstated from Metropolitan Police resources.
- She is very hopeful as councillors are that the Officer will be reinstated.



Youth Engagement, cont/d...

Kelmscott School

- WF has recruited Deputy Head of Kelmscott School as the Children and Young People's Commissioner.
- Her role will be launched at the Youth Conference on 16th October.
- One of her projects over the course of the next year is the 'I make a difference' campaign, where young people from across the borough will be awarded for the many different positive contributions they make to our community.



Youth Engagement, cont/d

14 Young Advisors

- Recruited one year ago. Trained to 'youth-proof' anything and everything going on for young people in the borough.
- The scheme has been going from strength to strength, with the young people involved in delivering local community events & sitting on national ministerial panels, such as the REACH panel to improve the aspirations of young black men.
- In the last few weeks, one from the group has been appointed as a personal advisor to Hazel Blears MP and will be working with her around youth issues over the next year.



Youth Engagement, cont/d

Youth Independent Advisory Group on community safety issues.

- Comprises of 15 young people aged 15 - 21 who have all had experience of the criminal justice system, either as victims, witnesses or perpetrators of crime.
- The group has been key in forming the police and community responses to recent incidents in WF and has also begun a training programme whereby the young people are training new police recruits around sensitive stop and search techniques.
- The first session was held on Wednesday 24th September at Norlington School for Boys and was a great success.



Orphan Sites project

- There are a number of sites around the borough that have an uncared for or unkempt look. They look like orphans, as if no one owns them.
- These sites can attract vandalism and other forms of anti-social behaviour - these areas can bring down the look and feel of a neighbourhood.
- WF is trying to identify where these 'orphan sites' are located.
- Once we have a list of potential orphan sites we will begin a process of investigating the ownership and identifying appropriate management options to improve the site.

St James Street Library

- Cabinet meeting held, 30 September 2008
- Cabinet agreed not to accept the Scrutiny's recommendation to reconsider its decision to close St James Street Library taken by Cabinet and confirmed by Council in February 2007.
